What is the Ministries of Pastoral Care School?

Our teaching and healing ministry is conducted through MPC Schools. Some come to their first school after encountering one of Leanne Payne's books while others have learned about the ministry through the testimony of a friend. All share a desire to gather with others and experience more of Incarnational Reality, the life we have in Christ:
