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## Hands-on ministry

At MPC schools most healing occurs in the context of the large-group sessions. Only trained prayer ministers will pray with registrants individually and all prayer ministers will be wearing red lanyards.

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## Optional workshops

Workshops will be offered on Wednesday, July 28 in the afternoon. Workshop titles and locations will be announced from the front and on the screen in the meeting room.

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## Breaks

There will be short breaks between lectures. Coffee, tea, cocoa, and water will be available in the refreshment center in Chalet Lodge and in all the lodges on site.

# Cedar Springs Retreat Center Information

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## Cedar Springs grounds

There are many beautiful walking paths in the area adjoining the lodges, as well as hiking trails throughout the eight acres of grounds. A map of the grounds is provided on the back page of this booklet. A trail map for those who want to venture further is available at the office. If you go hiking, we recommend wearing comfortable shoes, layered clothing, and taking water and a snack. Please be aware that hiking in the area involves steep trails and high trestles. Use of the grounds and trails are at your own risk.

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## Accommodations

We hope you enjoy the beautiful rooms, ensuite baths, and pleasant landscapes at Cedar Springs! Linens are provided and towels will be refreshed mid-week.

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## WiFi

You may sign in under CSGuest-2 or CSGuest-5. The password is CSGuest! (case sensitive). The WiFi connection is very limited at Cedar Springs, which is one of the trade-offs of being in such a rural and beautiful area! Please enjoy the respite this affords and enjoy some peace and quiet this week.

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## Meals

Beginning with dinner on Sunday, July 25, family-style meals served at table will be in the Lakeside Dining Hall located in the Chalet Lodge.

For all registrants, 15 meals are provided (breakfast, lunch, and dinner). The final meal is lunch on Friday, July 30.

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## Free beverage service

Regular and decaf coffee, hot tea, cider, cocoa, and ice water are available in each lodge all day. A beverage station is also available at the back of the meeting hall in Chalet Lodge for refreshment during break times. The town of Sumas, where Cedar Springs is located, recently won an award for best tasting water in the nation!

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## Health

We request that everyone practice good hygiene while living in community during our time together. Please use the hand sanitizer provided. If you feel unwell, please notify the registrar and self-quarantine in your room.

Refrigeration for medication is available in small fridges at the beverage centers in each lodge. Guests must bring their own sharps disposal. Please safely dispose of all medical waste before checking out of your room.

Health services are not available at Cedar Springs. There is a drugstore in Sumas, as well as urgent care facilities in Sumas and Lynden, and St. Joseph Hospital in Bellingham.

In the same way, after supper He took the cup and recited the blessing giving You thanks: Blessed are You, O Lord our God, King of the universe, who creates the fruit of the vine. He gave it to them saying, "Drink this, all of you. This is My blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it in remembrance of Me."

His dominion is everlasting, and His kingdom is one that will not be destroyed.

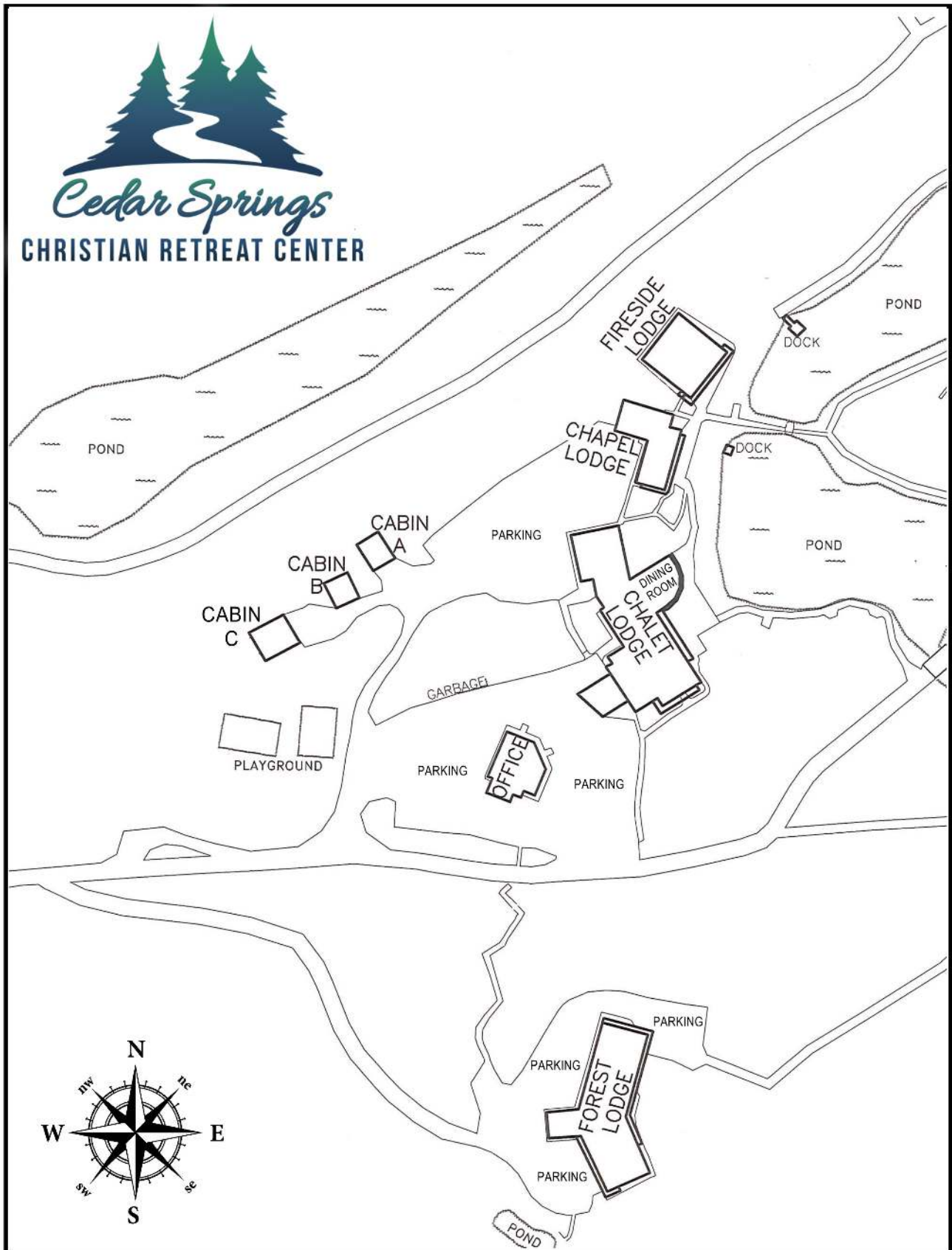
